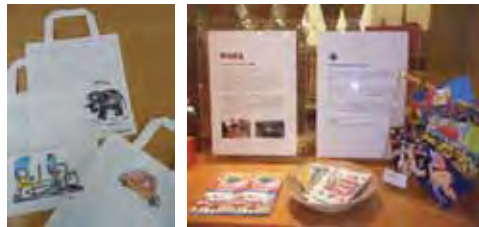


**Mujirushi Ryohin – The sale of My Bags, decorated with artwork by Indian children**
