
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♦KIDS EARTH FUND Calendar for Year 2011!!

KIDS EARTH FUND × CANICA Art Workshops in Oaxaca, Mexico



From July 19 to 24, 2010, Kids Earth Fund went to Oaxaca, Mexico to conduct a joint project with CANICA: holding art workshops and donating art supplies. Although Oaxaca is known as a tourist spot where good old charming Mexican streets and town still remain, it is the second poorest state in Mexico due to the lack of major industries

At CANICA's day-care center, there are 8 children in the 1 to 3 year-old class, 23 children in the 3 to 6 year-old class, and 39 children in the 6 to 15 year-old class. This time, we did workshop with the 3 to 6 year-old and 6 to 15 year-old class. There were some children who had never touched paints before. After practicing how to use the paints with their art teacher. children painted on their drawing paper with acrylic paints and water paints. All the children were very energetic and were having a lot of fun painting! Also, the 6 to 15 year-old class painted on big canvases in groups. They created wonderful, colorful Mexican pictures.

At the same time, at Casa CANTICA, KEF held another art workshop with the theme of Christmas. Some children asked questions how to write snow or what to write because they had never experienced cold Christmas. However, once they started, everyone painted very merry Christmas they imagine colorfully using acrylic paints. Everyone enjoyed the workshop, and it was filled with laughter and smiles the whole day.

After the one-week workshop, we donated color pencils, acrylic paints, and paint brushes to all the children who participated. They looked very happy to receive



the presents, and shared their joy with friends and teachers.

The bright smiles of the children shone like the sun, and made this activity very meaningful

From September 25, 2010 - October 12, 2010. Kids Earth Fund and students from Kyoto University of Arts and Design, Department of Arts and Child Studies had an exhibition "World Children's Exhibition -Gift from Children to the Earth -" at Gallery Aube, KEF has held over 3,000 exhibitions in the past and this exhibition was the largest of all. There were over 250 paintings of all sizes painted by children. which brightened up the gallery. The paintings were selected by the students. Also the students conducted art workshops held before the exhibition and created flyers, pamphlet and small information cards to put beside pictures. During the exhibition, there were many events in which both children and adults can enjoy.



On September 25, Monday, we invited children from the neighborhood for an art workshop. On October 1, Friday, Mr. Meguro, a professor of Kyushu University joined us for the gallery talk reception. On October 2, Saturday, the students from the Department of Arts and Child Studies held an art workshop with children coming from children's hall near school. On October 19, Saturday, Mr. Ryoji Arai, a children's book writer and a professor of Kyoto University of Arts and Design, also held an art workshop for children.

Acrylic paints donated by Turner Colour Works and POSCA markers and art supplies donated by Uni Mitsubishi Pencil were used for the art workshops. All the children were very excited to use variety of art materials for their drawings.

Thank you for all the contribution, this workshop was able to end with many smiling faces and laughter. Furthermore, we were able to distribute the message and idea of the children to all 700 people that came to the exhibition.





Kokuritsu Musashino Gakuin Art work shop



On July 16, an art workshop, which targeted nine 15 year-old male students, was held at Kokuritsu Musashino Gakuin. Musashino Gakuin is a children's self-reliance support facility. Kids Earth Fund has activities with students at the school once or twice every year. This time. we introduced and explained about KEF and the activities in two classes as a part of their course. We first studied and discussed harsh and difficult circumstances children in the world are facing, and then moved onto an art workshop. The theme of the workshop was chosen during discussion among the students, and they decided to paint pictures focusing on the beauty of Japan. They wanted the other children around the world to see the beauty of Japan. The sun, ocean, rainbow, desert. sunset, cherry blossom and the moon passage of time in one day - were drawn in a picture. The heart shaped earth was added in the center of the painting to symbolize the peace in the world. The artwork they produced gave an impact and a power, and all the students looked contented. After the workshop, they helped us clean up, which showed the warm heart and kindness in children.



Art Workshop @ Tokyo Medical and Dental University Hospital Faculty of Medicine

On August 19, Thursday, we held an art workshop at the pediatric ward in the Tokyo Medical and Dental University Hospital Faculty of Medicine. The theme for this workshop was summer, and we painted on Japanese style paper fans. It was the first time all the children made their own fans. When they finished, they ran to their mothers and fathers to show what they made. Everyone looked very happy, and it was a workshop filled with smiles.



Art Workshop @ Tokyo Akiruno Gakuen Everyone's Summer



On August 21, Saturday, we held an art workshop at the Tokyo Akiruno Gakuen with the help of teachers and volunteers. The theme for the workshop was "Everyone's Summer," and children who participated in the workshop painted what they like about summer and their memory of summer on big three canvases.

In the beginning, we explained about Kids Earth Fund and its activities to the children. They seemed thrilled to hear that their paintings would make other children all around the world happy.

Art Workshop @ The Jikei University Hospital

Art work shop @ Toho University Medical Center Omori Hospital

Art work shop @ Kanagawa Prefectural Child Medical Center
